One bright spot for me in February is St. Valentine's Day. It is an opportunity for us as Christians to remember the love God has for us and the love we ought to have for each other. As she stood there, her face turning crimson, the little girl sitting next to the new boy reached over and placed her left hand in his right hand and said, "Let's make this church together." That is the church. People loving and helping people because Christ is the source of their love.

If you have any questions about love and how to define it, read I Corinthians 13 and make it a living testimony of your life. Then others will know who you are because of your love. May the Lord bless you always.

# Bright Beginnings

Bright Beginnings welcomed in 2011 with a Pajama Party/New Year Party in each of the classes. The children really enjoyed wearing their pajamas to school, and it gave Mom and Dad an easy morning for the first day back. We had a lot going on in January. On the 11th we started our In-House Registration for September classes. This was for children currently enrolled, younger siblings, or members of the church. (Our 34th Annual Open House will be on Saturday, February 5th, with a snow date of Saturday, February 12th. This is when registration will be open to everyone else.)

In January we also began our progress reports for the 4 and 5 year olds. We check to see what each child has learned so far, and this helps us to know what we need to review. It also helps the parents to see how well their child is prepared for kindergarten. These reports get sent home about mid-February. The educational goal for Bright Beginnings is to fully prepare our children for kindergarten. We attend meetings and workshops held by the North Penn School District, to ensure that the children are learning everything they need to know to enter kindergarten. This includes letter sounds, numbers, letter and number recognition and writing them. We also are learning beginnings sight words, cutting, pasting and other fine motor skills. We incorporate our large motor skills in our gym class that is held one day a week in Stringer Auditorium. We have balls, soccer nets, basketball nets, hoola hoops, parachutes, ribbons for dancing, scooters, beanbags, etc. The children love gym day! We also have Miss Judy who comes and leads the children in music. This includes singing, playing instruments, dancing, marching and other fun games.

11A.M. to 1P.M.

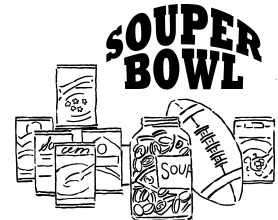

Hard to believe but before too long it will be spring and again time for UMW to mail April Care Packages to our LUMC military and college youth.

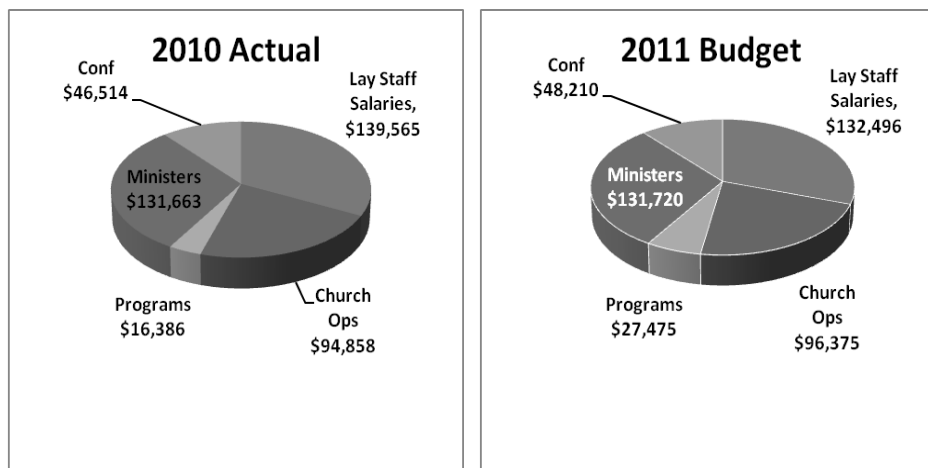

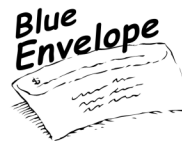
