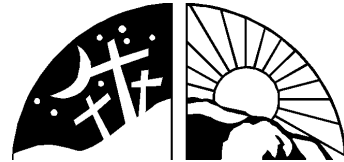

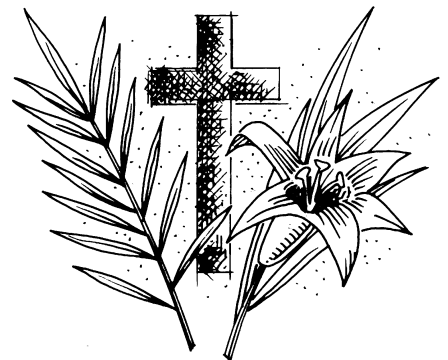

Dear Friends,

We know the story so well. A man named Jesus lived for 33 years in what we refer to as the Holy Land. Jesus taught, healed, and touched people's lives as they have never been touched before. But there were those who were threatened by his teachings especially when he claimed to be the Son of God. So they nailed him on a cross between two thieves. He was laid in a borrowed tomb. On the third day God raised him from the dead. He appeared to his friends and his disciples. Later these friends and disciples struggled to understand the full impact of his life on theirs. Guided by the Holy Spirit they began to understand that they had been witnesses to a great drama. This was no mere man that they had followed. It was God clothed in human flesh. And the cross on which he died was a necessary part of that drama. That's the story. But what does it really mean?

In order to understand the meaning of the cross, we must deal with the sins we commit in our daily lives. If we do not sense the power of sin in our life, we can never adequately understand the cross. No atom of our body is exempt from the corrupting and corrosive power of sin. Sin destroys our peace of mind, it brings death to sacred relationships, it causes us to wander far from God. Sin maims human bodies, breaks up families, and murders both young and old. Sin is a cancer for which there is only one cure. That cure is Christ. God knows what hurts us. God knows what can destroy us. God gives us what can heal us. What can save us is Jesus the Christ dying on the cross of Calvary.

Once we deal with our sin and understand its relationship to the cross, we can enjoy the promises of the Resurrection of Jesus. The Cross and the Resurrection of Christ cannot be separated. They are eternally connected. There is no resurrection without Jesus dying on the cross. The Cross of Jesus pays the penalty for our sins. The Resurrection of Jesus gives us the gift of life that our sin took away. Jesus came that we may have life, eternally and abundantly.

Easter is a celebration of that new life. Jesus was raised from the dead as the first-fruit of the resurrected life. Through Him we have the promise of eternal life that one day there will be the resurrection of the dead. All those who have died in Christ will one day be clothed in a glorified body like Christ manifested when He appeared after His Resurrection. He has promised us victory over death. We have eternal life.

Jesus also promised that we would have life and have it abundantly. When we go to the cross with our sin and its power over us, when we acknowledge the forgiveness of that sin and its penalty, when we give Christ control of our life, we experience a spiritual resurrection. That sin no longer has dominion over us and we are free to be transformed into His image. Christ sets us free to become the people God created us to be. That is abundant life. New life in Christ is the Easter message. As this Easter arrives, renew your life in Christ.

The word "Tenebrae" means "darkness." In this service, seven candles are gradually extinguished, symbolizing the flight and denial of the disciples and friends of Jesus as the story of the crucifixion unfolds. An eighth candle, symbolizing Christ, remains lighted throughout the service. The light of Christ can never be extinguished.

This is a pilgrimage of a lifetime. It will transform you and how you read the Scriptures.

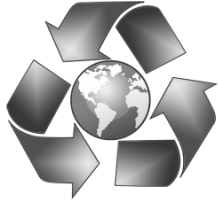

Yes Reborn, and Reborn, and Reborn Again!

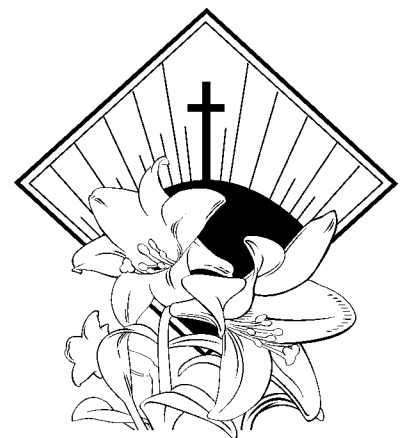
When I, in worldly pleasures rest, or walk with sins I show

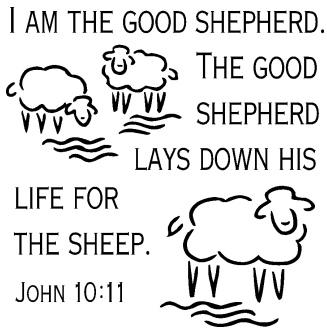

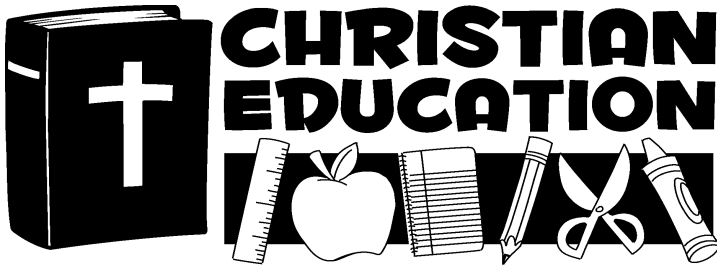
